■ Department of Japanese

The training we provide produces Japanese language specialists who possess a deeper understanding of Japan's society and culture, as well as a combination of international sensibilities and erudition.

■ Department of English

Students acquire sophisticated, practical communication skills in classes that offer many opportunities for discussion and debate in English.

■ Department of Chinese

Providing thorough language training with a unique teaching system that focuses on speaking skills, students acquire practical Chinese language skills that can pass muster in international society.

Faculty of Economics

■ Department of Economics

Our training provides business professionals a means to survive the current global society, a high level of skills in the respective fields of public policy, finance, management, accounting, and financial affairs, as well as knowledge encompassing everything from local to international society.

Faculty of Real Estate Sciences

■ Department of Real Estate Sciences

This is the only faculty in Japan that produces real estate experts with the knowledge required in real-world settings by providing comprehensive study of six areas of real estate: distribution, finance, development, investment, business management, and property management.

School of Hospitality & Tourism Management

■ Department of Hospitality & Tourism Management Tourism Major

Students study various aspects of the tourism industry—including travel, hotels, airlines, and weddings—to acquire a hospitality mindset as well as the practical English-language skills required.

Global Management Major

All courses related to tourism and management are conducted in English, and students sharpen their language skills and abilities to a global standard by studying abroad for one year.

■ Scholarships

1 Meikai University Urayasu Campus Scholarship System (for International Students)

This scholarship system provides financial support to international students in the form of an exemption from their first year of tuition.

- (1) Eligibility
 - Privately funded international students who enrolled by taking the special entrance exam for international students.
 - Persons who have passed level N1 of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test
- (2) Exemption amount

All tuition for the first year of enrollment (¥698,000 annually)

2 Monbukagakusho Honors Scholarship for Privately Financed International Students (International Students Acceptance Promotion Program)

This scholarship program is for privately financed international students. There is a reserve bracket for prospective students with outstanding EJU scores and a general bracket for all other students. The number of applicants for the general bracket changes every year.

There is also a special bracket for applications from students enrolled in the MEXT-approved educational program that supports international students wishing to work in Japan.

Note: Please note that there may not be any general or special brackets offered.

Producing People with Advanced, Specialized Knowledge and Skills

Graduate School of Applied Linguistics

The Graduate School of Applied Linguistics was established as the first graduate school in Japan to transcend the boundaries between academic fields that had previously been studied separately, such as linguistics (theoretical linguistics), education, and psychology. Applied linguistics is a general term for the field that examines language and related human linguistic behavior from multiple perspectives. This graduate school offers three courses—the Language Education Course, Language Theory Course, and Language Culture Course—and focuses on helping students acquire specialized knowledge.

Doctoral Program: Doctoral degree in applied linguistics or doctoral degree in Japanese-language education

Graduate School of Economics

The Graduate School of Economics considers that the current economic issues facing Japan and other major developed countries can be summarized by four key-words: "economic globalization," "intensifying international competition," "the division of roles between the public and private sectors," and "harmony between development, the environment, and welfare." The graduate school sees today's uncertain economic conditions as an ideal opportunity to seek out new analytical approaches and conducts a wide range of research activities with a strong practical orientation.

Scholarships

1 Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship

There is a system whereby privately financed international students in the graduate school are granted scholarships by the Japanese government.

(1) Qualifications (graduate students): Applicants must be under 35 years of age as of April 1. (Please be aware that other conditions apply.)

(2) Scholarship amount

Graduate students: Doctoral students: ¥148,000/month

Master's students: ¥147,000/month
(until the standard program is completed)

Note: Those who have acquired or expect to acquire a bachelor's degree at a four-year university are eligible.

- 3 Individuals who are recognized by the graduate school through individual screening as having academic ability equivalent of (or higher than) that of university graduates, and will reach the age of 22 at the time of admission
Note: Those to whom this requirement applies are mainly graduates from junior colleges, specialized vocational high schools, vocational schools, other miscellaneous schools, etc.

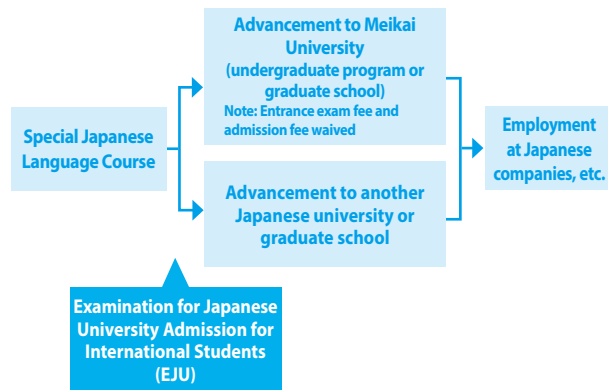
A University Open to the World

About the Special Japanese Language Course

The Special Japanese Language Course was established in 1991. It embodies the Meikai University spirit of international exchange and provides the kind of Japanese-language education that students need in order to pursue an education at the university level.

The major difference between this special course and an ordinary Japanese-language school is that the purpose of the former is to enable students to pursue higher education at the undergraduate and graduate school level in Japan. Students who complete one year of this program can pursue an undergraduate or graduate school education at Meikai University or any other national, public, or private university or graduate school in Japan.

Model Case of Advancement to Higher Education



Persons accepted into a Meikai University undergraduate faculty/school or graduate school after passing the Special Japanese Language course will be exempt from paying the admission fee. In addition, persons who pass level N1 of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test will receive an exemption from their first year of tuition (¥698,000; excluding School of Health Sciences and School of Dentistry).

Special Features

1 Classes Divided into Small Groups by Skill Level

Breaking the class up by skill level ensures that lessons can be specifically tailored to students and conducted as efficiently as possible.

2 Practical Curriculum

The course offers a practical curriculum, the ultimate goal of which is to enable students to continue their education at a Japanese university.

3 Enrollment by Recommendation

Students who excel in their studies can enroll in Meikai University (Faculty of Languages and Cultures, Faculty of Economics, Faculty of Real Estate Sciences, or School of Hospitality & Tourism Management) by recommendation.

4 Interaction with Japanese Students

Various event programs to promote interaction and experiences with Japanese language and culture are organized, including activities with students of the Faculty of Languages and Cultures.

Curriculum Well-Rounded Curriculum

Curriculum

The goal of this course is to bring students' Japanese-language skills up to the level required for taking classes at the undergraduate or graduate school level. It is designed for international students who are hoping to enroll in a university or graduate school program.

Furthermore, by enhancing students' understanding of Japanese culture and society, this program aims to help improve their quality of life and ability to communicate while living in Japan.

Japanese Language

Systematic Japanese-language education is provided based on each student's level of Japanese. The curriculum aims to help students perform well on the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU), which measures the skills that are needed for admission to a university.

- Grammar
- Kanji/hiragana/katakana and vocabulary
- Oral expression
- Listening comprehension
- Reading comprehension
- Written expression

Liberal Arts

By teaching a broad range of subjects, including Japanese geography, industry, history, and current affairs, this course aims to give students a more in-depth understanding of Japan.

- Japanese affairs

General Education

The course offers classes on subjects that are on the EJU and university entrance exams.

- English (*)
- Mathematics
- Society

Note: Although not an EJU subject, English-language study is essential because it may be assessed during entrance exams, and many universities make it a compulsory subject after enrollment.

Selection Process and Results

1 Application Method

Regarding applications, please mail your application documents to the Special Japanese Language Course office or deliver them there in person.

2 Selection Process

Students will be comprehensively evaluated based on their application materials and online examination/interview.

3 Notification of Acceptance/Rejection

Applicants will be notified in writing whether they have been accepted for admission (by mail).

Application Requirements

1 Individuals who have completed 12 years of normal school education in a foreign country and equivalent individuals

2 Individuals who have spent 150 hours or more studying the Japanese language (Priority will be given to those who have achieved N5 or higher on the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test [JLPT], J-Test F level and above, and NAT-TEST level 5 or higher.)

Note: Those living in regions that do not use Chinese characters (countries other than China, Taiwan, and South Korea) need to have achieved N4 or higher on JLPT.

3 When an individual who is enrolled in a Japanese-language educational institution in Japan applies for admission, he or she will be required to have met certain standards in terms of grade and attendance rate. (As a rule, his or her grades must be at the passing level [60% or higher], and he or she must have an hour-based attendance rate of 90% or greater.)

Notes: 1. If an applicant has been enrolled in another Japanese-language educational institution in Japan for more than a year, he or she is ineligible to apply for admission.

2. Individuals who are in Japan on a short-term (tourism) visa shall not be considered "applicants in Japan."

Enrichment and Enhancement of Japanese-Language Studies

The Japanese-language studies program for international students has been enriched to improve the effectiveness of studying at this university.

Key points

- ◆ Participation in this class is now mandatory, and will be conducted on an intensive basis during the first year following enrollment.
- ◆ Classes are small, with around twenty students per class.
- ◆ We support students taking external examinations (JLPT, BJT, etc.) from the time of admission to graduation, and use the results to point out ways for students to improve their Japanese-language skills.

Note: Students who have passed JLPT N1 and will not be participating in the MGO International Student Support Program are exempt from taking these courses, and will take "Basic Studies I-III" just like Japanese students do.

- ◆ Special classes for international students have been created.
- ◆ Internships for international students have been implemented, mainly aimed at future employment in companies in Japan or Japanese companies overseas.

MEXT-approved MGO International Student Support Program

MEXT has certified this as an educational program that supports international students wishing to work in Japan. The MGO program provides Japanese-language education, career education, and internship programs according to the students' Japanese-language abilities, and fosters human resources who are able to find employment in Japan.

1 Japanese-Language Education

Students will be separated into classes according to their Japanese-language abilities at the time of enrollment, and will receive Japanese-language education starting in the first year.

● Students who have not yet obtained JLPT N1T

Students will take "Academic Japanese Standard Class" and Japanese Advanced Skills course with the goal of obtaining Level N1.

● Students who have not yet obtained JLPT N1

Students will take "Academic Japanese High Class" during their first year and "Business Japanese Course" during the second year to improve their Japanese-language skills.

2 Career Education

Career development education is provided from the second semester of the first year through the second year. Faculty members, employment coaching staff and Career Support Center staff also provide career support to each student in the program who take the Career Design course in their third year.

3 Internship

Students who have obtained Level N1 Japanese-language skills will participate in an internship at a program-designated company during the summer and spring vacations of the second year and the summer vacation of the third year of at least two weeks.

International students who have completed all of 1 to 3 above will receive a certificate of completion.

Students who obtain a certificate of completion will receive guidance from the employment coaching staff beginning in their fourth year.

Entrance Exams for Transfer Students, Junior College Graduates and University Graduates

The Department of Japanese, Department of English, Department of Chinese, Department of Economics, Department of Real Estate Sciences, and Department of Hospitality & Tourism Management are accepting third-year transfer students (including those who graduated from junior colleges, etc.) and university graduates, including international students.

■ Exam Subjects (general)

Short essay and interview

Note: The interview for the Department of English includes the English-language proficiency test.

■ Application Requirements

- 1** (Junior college graduates) Individuals who have graduated or expect to graduate in March 2027 from a junior college. This includes overseas junior colleges and schools located in Japan designated as equivalent to a foreign junior college (for example, the Japanese branch of a foreign university considered the equivalent of a junior college by the minister of education, culture, sports, science and technology).
- 2** (Junior college graduates) Individuals (as noted in Article 90, Clause 1 of the School Education Act) who have completed a postsecondary course at a specialized training college or expect to complete such a course in March 2027. The course must have a term of two years or longer, and meet criteria determined by the minister of education, culture, sports, science and technology.
- 3** (Transfers from another university) Must have been enrolled in a university in Japan (other than Meikai University) for two or more years and obtained sixty-two or more credits (includes anyone who expects to fulfill the above requirements by March 2027).
- 4** (University graduates) Must have obtained a bachelor's degree or expect to obtain one by March 2027.
- 5** Department of Economics applicants must have a grade of B or higher in the Economics Record Examination or a Level 2 rank or higher in the Japanese Chamber of Commerce and Industry's bookkeeping certification test.
- 6** Applicants to the Department of Real Estate Sciences who wish to major in real estate appraisal must have passed the Real Estate Transaction Specialist Qualification Examination.

7 Applicants to the Department of English or Department of Hospitality & Tourism Management (Tourism major) must possess English-language abilities equivalent to CEFR level B1 or higher, as evaluated in a test such as the EIKEN (see the 2027 transfer student/junior college graduate/university graduate admission application guidelines for details).

8 Applicants to the Management & Informatics major of the Department of Hospitality & Tourism Management must have obtained an IT Passport certificate. They must also possess English-language abilities equivalent to CEFR level A2 or higher, as evaluated in a test such as the EIKEN (see the 2027 transfer student/junior college graduate/university graduate admission application guidelines for details).

9 Applicants to the Department of Hospitality & Tourism Management (Global Management major) must have scored 6.5 or higher on the IELTS or 80 or higher on the TOEFL iBT within two years of the entrance exam date.

10 International students must have acquired Level N1 (formerly known as Level 1) on the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test, or demonstrate equivalent proficiency in Japanese. (This does not include applicants for the School of Hospitality & Tourism Management [Global Management major])

11 International students who were or are enrolled at a Japanese language school or an institution such as a professional training college in Japan must have maintained an attendance record of 90 percent or higher at the last school they attended for the period our school designates.
 Note: Excludes junior colleges.

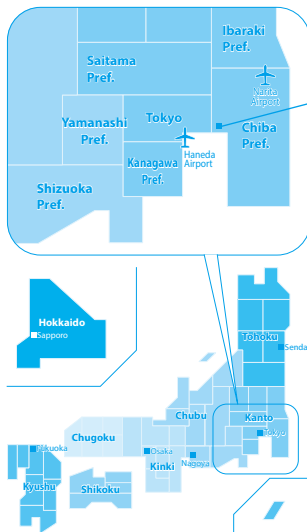

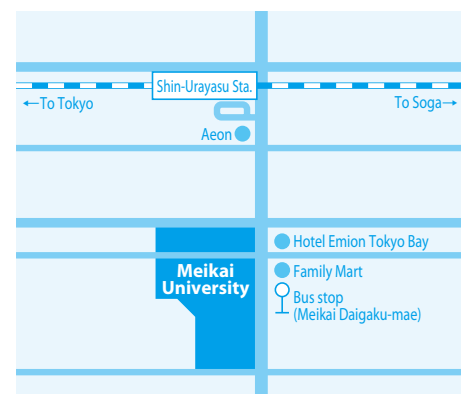
